Non Agenda Items:

- 1. Water tender update-Kyle from Nor Cal EVI is still awaiting delivery of the final set of lights. Monty Salas-Cordrey has continued to follow up every two weeks, with the most recent update on Sunday, September 7, confirming that the lights had not yet arrived.
- 2. FEMA Grant-We will be looking into an in-district responder during the week. The District would look into the funding if possible. More discussion on this during the next board meeting.

- 1. Project & Grant Updates-
- a. Landowner Collaboration- Audrey Wardwell has identified and received APNs, mailing addresses, and property owner names for all parcels abutting Tassajara Road (up to Jamesburg Station) and Cachagua Road. Her plan is to begin mapping and identifying high-risk properties.
- b. CAL Fire Grant Opportunities-This item is on hold until the mapping is completed, and our 501(c)(3) status is updated. However, Audrey Wardwell does have a meeting scheduled with Monty Salas-Cordrey and Tom Nason to explore opportunities for collaboration.
- c. FireWise Community Development- Boundaries have been identified for properties abutting the major roads. The next step is to schedule and host a community meeting to move forward with FireWise certification.
 - d. Community Grazing Opportunities- No new progress since our last meeting.
- g. Fire Mitigation Mapping Progress- Continued efforts are being pursued to progress with the fire mitigation mapping.
- 2. Chief Resignation- Kevin Dixon resigned as Chief on August 14. The board is conducting interviewers to find the next fulltime Chief for Cachagua Fire.
